So, some of this year's highlights? The year started well with the opening of the town's new **Tourist Information Centre & Council Offices** on the seafront, which has dealt with almost 4,000 enquiries, since it opened in April 2022.



The sun shone and a rainbow appeared over Lyme Bay, as the ribbon was cut!




The highlight of the year was, undoubtedly, the **Seaton Summer Celebration** to mark Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee. On a glorious day in June, over 3,200 people came together to enjoy a community picnic, whilst listening to local musicians and watching a display by Seaton Majorettes. Laser clay pigeon shooting, circus skills and lots of fun stalls for children run by an array of community groups were also on offer, along with free ice cream! The evening culminated with choirs, buglers and the lighting of a beacon as part of a Commonwealth-wide ceremony. So popular was the event, that the Council will be running Seaton Summer Celebration again in 2023.






Sadly, just 3 months later, the country said goodbye to HM Queen Elizabeth II, after 70 years of service. Marshlands hosted a **Book of Condolence** where residents could pay their respects and spend a moment of quiet reflection.



Once the national period of mourning had passed, other successful events included the **Outdoor Cinema** in Cliff Field Gardens and the **Christmas Lights Switch-On.** The Council's thanks go to Andrew Gwyn Davies for volunteering his time to run the outdoor cinema.



Another of the year's highlights was the development of **Seaton Beach School**, funded by the town council and The National Lottery, it has provided fun and informative sessions for local children, free of charge, throughout the school holidays. Delivered by local educational professionals, 'Crazy Crabs', the idea arose from a community consultation that requested more activities for children, especially in and around the beach and seafront.












As part of it's work to improve the local environment, the Town Council introduced a **2-minute Beach Clean Station** and a **Toy Library** from which residents and visitors can borrow a litter picker or toys and return them after use.



In partnership with East Devon District Council, the town's green spaces have been improved with the development of **Seaton Sensory Garden** at Seafield, which helped contribute to the town's ongoing **Green Flag** status.





Another successful partnership with East Devon District Council, and additional funding from Devon County Council, resulted in the installation of **beach matting to enable access onto the beach for residents and visitors in wheelchairs**. This was funded by all three authorities, and the initiative led by Seaton Town Council with the help of Nicky Dack - Seaton Town Council's Disability Champion. The town received extensive local and national television coverage as a result and this young man was able to share end of term fun with his classmates as a result.







Year on year, at the request of residents, the town council has provided more **benches in different locations** around the town. This year, benches with wheelchair access were installed in Windsor Gardens and picnic benches installed on the cliff top outside Cliff Field Gardens so that dog walkers can sit and enjoy the spectacular views.




